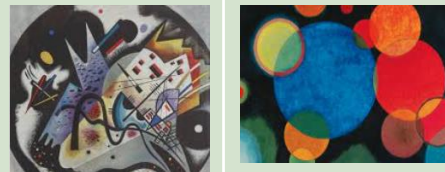
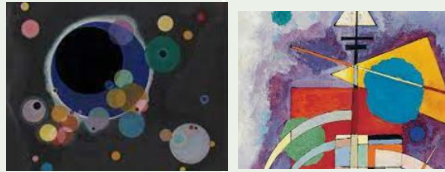
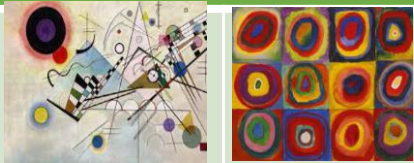

Kandinsky was famous for using geometric shapes and lines in his paintings.

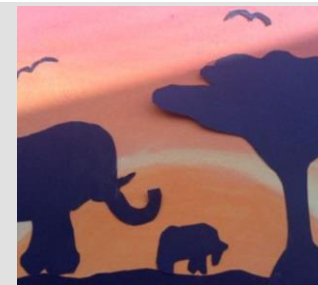
He started to use colours to express his reaction to a subject.

Kandinsky thought that paintings didn't need a particular subject, but that shapes and colours alone could be art.

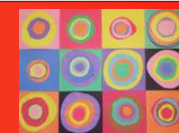
Kandinsky also thought he could express music through his art. He thought yellow was like a trumpet!

Secondary Colour	A secondary colour is a colour made by mixing of two primary colours.	
A Colour Wheel	This shows colours and their relationship to each other.	
Wassily Kandinsky	Wassily Kandinsky was a Russian artist famous for using forms, lines, and colours in his work.	
Collage	The gluing and arranging of material on a flat surface.	
Landscape	The depiction of a natural scene in art. Such as a mountain or fields.	
Horizon line	This is the point where the earth meets the sky.	
Layer	A thin sheet of a substance on top of a surface.	
Texture	How a surface feels when you touch it.
