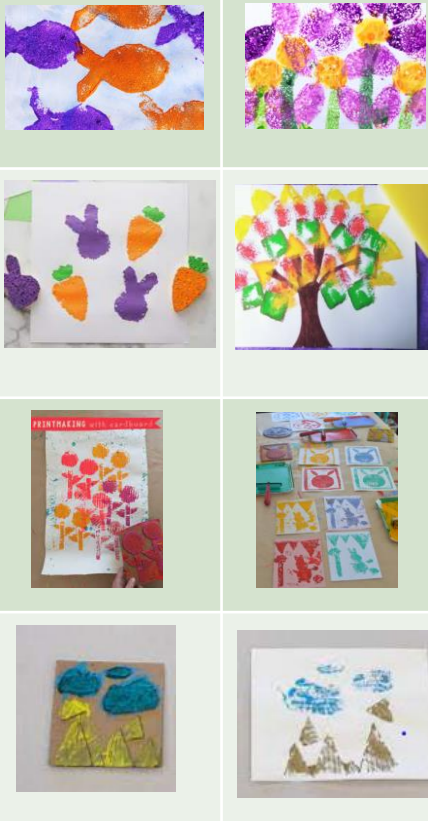

Different Printing Methods



Printing – Key Skills

Different tools such as corks, pens and sponges can be used to make a print.

Marks are made on an object, which is pressed onto a piece of paper or material to form a print.

We can look for patterns in our environment.

We can copy these patterns by repeating a print to show the same effect or pattern.

We take great care when pressing down our shape to create a clear printed shape.

Rollers are used to spread the paint evenly across a pallet before pressing the mold down.

The Printing Process

Print	Making marks on one piece of material and pressing this on a piece of paper to make a mark.	✓
Tool	An instrument such as a paintbrush or pencil which is used to create art.	
Marks	Using a tool press down into an object and leave a groove or mark in it.	
Groove	Deeper marks made by pressing down into an objects.	
Form	To make or create.	
Repeated	When something is done again in the same way.	
Environment	The immediate area around a person or living thing.	
Inspired	When you get a good idea from someone or something.	
Image	A picture or drawing of something.
