To know the location of the North and South poles.

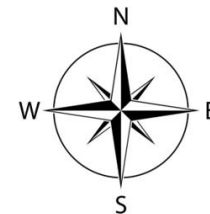
Equator

The equator is an imaginary line that divides the Earth in half. The weather on the equator is hot all year round.



Key Vocabulary

Weather	The conditions outside at a particular place and time	✓
Hail	Round pieces of frozen rain.	
Hurricane	A powerful storm with heavy rains and winds.	
Thunder	The loud cracking noise or low distant rumble that follows a flash of lightning.	
Snow	Snow is formed when water in the upper air freezes into crystals.	
Shower	A fall of rain that lasts a short time.	
Heatwave	A period of unusually hot weather.	
Seasons	One of the four parts of the year; spring, summer, autumn, and winter.
