Types of Recount Texts

Diaries

News reports

Writing about real events that have happened

Key Vocabulary

First person	Writing from the writer's perspective.
Past tense	Writing about something that has already happened.
Chronological order	Events are written in the order the happened in.
Time conjunctions	A word or phrase that links ideas together and tells the reader WHEN something is happening.
Adverbials	An adverbial is a word or phrase that is used as an adverb to give you more information about a verb or clause.

Purpose

To tell people about an event/s that have already happened.

Toolkit

- Include the date, time the entry was written.
- Written in the first person – **I, me, myself, we...**
- Facts about the main events written in the past tense.
- Written in the past tense when describing main events.
- Written in chronological order.
- Include time conjunctions.
- Use adverbials to show time and place.
- Include personal emotions and feelings.
