

Breakfast & After School Club - Behaviour Agreement

At Breakfast and After School Club, we provide a place for children to eat, relax, play games and have fun.

It is very important to us that all the children who attend the clubs feel welcome, happy and safe and in order to achieve this we have a behaviour agreement that we expect all children, staff and parents to adhere to.

We expect all children to:

- Listen to each other and respect each other's opinions.
- Be kind to each other.
- Speak to each other with respect and kindness.
- Not hurt anyone physically (this includes kicking, hitting, punching, biting or wrestling).
- Not intimidate other children, either physically or verbally.
- Go to an adult for help if someone is upsetting or hurting them.
- Look after the resources.

All of the adults will:

- Listen to everyone.
- Use the same system of warnings/yellow slips for all children.
- Share information with teachers or other adults in the school, because we all work together.

We ask all parents/carers to:

- Support our behaviour system and reinforce our rules at home.
- Share information with us. If something has happened at home that may be having an impact on your child's behaviour, please tell us because we might be able to help.

Reward and Warning System

At Breakfast and After School Club, staff follow the school's reward and warning system to help promote positive behaviour.

When children are kind, listen well, help each other and/or help the adults, they will receive praise & stickers, their parents/carers will be informed and they will have the chance to earn an end of term treat.

If children are not behaving in an acceptable way, they will receive a warning. If a child received a 2nd warning, they will be asked to sit out for 10 minutes to have "thinking time". If a 3rd warning is received, a member of the school leadership team will be called and a **yellow slip** will be issued (yellow slips are also used in school when a child displays unacceptable behaviour). The slip will be completed by a member of the Breakfast and After School Club team and shared with a parent/carer. If a parent/carer is unavailable (e.g. the incident took place at Breakfast Club), then it will be followed up with a telephone call or email. This information will also be shared with the child's teacher and other school staff, if deemed necessary.

If a child has received 2 or more yellow slips in a single week, or continues to receive regular yellow slips, we will ask to meet with a parent/carer to discuss ways in which we can support their child. Following this meeting, if the behaviour does not improve and the agreed expectations are not met, we will unfortunately have to terminate their place with immediate effect.

If a child seriously violates the rights of others, shows no signs of wanting to improve their behaviour, causes physical violence, damages school property or is physically/verbally aggressive, they will receive a **red slip** and a parent/carer will be called to collect their child immediately. The child will wait with a member of the school leadership team, until collected.

If a child receives a second red slip, within the same academic year, their place will be terminated with immediate effect.

We appreciate that our clubs are used as childcare for working families, however, our main priority is the safety and wellbeing of all our children and we will not tolerate any child's behaviour that impacts on our safe and happy environment.
